## **Music of Protest {Songs of the Labor Movement} 🎵 Wednesday, March 9, 2011 | 10am & 2pm**

Musician and storyteller Colin O'Brien presents American songs from the Labor Rights movement and the stories that inspired them. Focusing primarily on the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries this concert will address labor songs from the slave era and modern instances of labor protest music. This concert is from the series "Music of Protest," developed by WCM and Social Studies teachers from Lincoln Center for the Arts to directly address topics from the MPS 8<sup>th</sup> Grade social studies curriculum.

## **Music of the African Diaspora 🎵 Tues, April 5 | 10am & 12:30pm / Wed, April 6, 2011 | 10am & 2pm**

"Music of the African Diaspora" will trace the thread of African music that came across the Atlantic Ocean and became embedded in the cultures of the Caribbean Islands, the United States and South America. Jahmes Finlayson and five other Conservatory artists/educators from diverse ethnic backgrounds will use storytelling and their instruments to guide students along the path the music took as it came to the New World.
