POSITION CONCEPT

This position is responsible for teaching private lessons in violin to students of all ages and abilities; Suzuki training is a plus; ability to teach violin to beginning students is helpful but not necessary. This Faculty member will have a history of high level professional performance experience as a violinist, collegiate study in string pedagogy and significant successful teaching experience. This individual must show exceptional maturity and an ability to effectively communicate and follow the mission of the Conservatory and the policies of the President and Board of Directors.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The duties of this position include, but are not limited to:

- Teach private violin lessons; Faculty members are expected to teach a minimum of 38 weeks of lessons per year.
- Teach Suzuki class and/or lead a string ensemble, if appropriate, as assigned.
- Teach in Conservatory Connections programs, if appropriate, as assigned.
- Communicate regularly and in a timely manner with Student Services regarding teaching schedule, customer billing and payroll.
- Work in cooperation with the Vice President of Education and Department Chair regarding course offerings and departmental activities.
- Follow rules and procedures as outlined in the Employee Handbook.
- Provide the highest level of customer service in all areas of customer relations.

QUALIFICATIONS

EDUCATION: Master's degree in music education or performance. At least one degree in music education and/or 10 years of private teaching experience, and Suzuki training preferred.

RELATED EXPERIENCE: The successful candidate will have: exceptional pedagogical skills; strong oral and written communication skills; thorough knowledge of the musical area of specialty; a successful history of professional music performance; excellent organizational skills; an ability to maintain the highest professional ethics at all times.
